Family Reunification with a Non-Eu Citizen Visa (National Visa)

1. National Visa Application Form.

2. One recent [ICAO](#)-compliant photograph.

3. Proof of residence within the consular jurisdiction:

-Proof of legal residence in Malaysia, as long-term stay visa, must have a validity of at least three (3) remaining months.

4. Valid passport, original plus one photocopy, with an expiry date at least three months beyond the expiry date of the requested visa.

5. Proof of transportation arrangements:

-Confirmed flight reservation (one way).

Note: If the trip includes multiple stops, provide reservations for any intra-stop (trains, flights, car rentals).

6. Nulla Osta (Entry Clearance Authorization) issued by the competent Immigration One-Stop Desk (Sportello Unico per l'Immigrazione).

Note:

The "Nulla Osta" is valid **6 months** from the issuing day, therefore you should submit your request accordingly.

7. Copies of the identity documents of the sponsoring foreign national in Italy (passport), together with copies of the Italian residence permit and Italian identity card.

Note: Copies of all pages of the sponsor's passport in Italy must be provided.

8. Proof of relationship: marriage/civil partnership/birth certificate (original plus one photocopy).

Note:

- marriage/civil partnership certificates older than 6 months will NOT be accepted;

-certificates issued by a foreign authority other than Malaysia, MUST be translated in English or Italian and legalised by the Italian Consular Office of the issuing Country OR by the Consular Authority in Malaysia of the issuing Country.

-certificates issued by one of the Schengen countries will be accepted only if multilingual, otherwise please refer to second note;

Note:

If either or both spouses were previously divorced, the divorce certificate must also be submitted. If issued by a foreign authority other than Malaysia, MUST be translated in English or Italian and legalised by the Italian Consular Office of the issuing Country OR by the Consular Authority in Malaysia of the issuing Country.

For Applicants Under 18 Years of Age Reuniting with a Parent in Italy

9. If the other parent remains in Malaysia, an authorization to travel abroad (affidavit) signed by that parent. The affidavit must also indicate who will accompany the minor during travel and must be translated and legalized.

Note: If the minor travels with one parent and is reuniting with the other parent in Italy, no travel authorization is required.

12. Copy of the identity document (passport) of the parent residing in Malaysia who authorizes the minor's travel and signs the affidavit.

13. In the event of a parent's death: the original death certificate, apostilled/legalized and accompanied by an Italian translation.

14. For adopted minors before the parent(s) move(s) to Italy:
-documentation proving the adoption, apostilled/ legalized and translated into Italian.

For Applicants Over 18 Years of Age Reuniting with a Parent in Italy

15. In addition to the documents referred to in point 8, documentation proving that the family member is financially dependent on the foreign citizen because they are unable to independently meet their essential living needs due to a health condition resulting in total disability.

16. Where applicable, an affidavit from the person receiving and transferring money to the applicant, apostilled/ legalized, together with a copy of that person's identity document.

If the Applicant Is the Parent of the Foreign Citizen

17. In addition to the documents referred to in point 7, documentation proving that the parent is financially dependent on the foreign citizen.

18. If the parent is over 65 years of age and has other children in the country of origin, documentation proving that those children are unable to provide support due to serious and documented health reasons.

The Embassy reserves the right to request any additional documentation if deemed necessary.
