Family Reunification Visa (with Italian or EU Citizens) (National D Visa)

1. National Visa Application Form.

2. One recent ICAO-compliant photograph.

3. Proof of residence within the consular jurisdiction:

-Proof of legal residence in Malaysia, as long-term stay visa, must have a validity of at least three (3) remaining months.

4. Valid passport, original plus one photocopy, with an expiry date at least three months beyond the expiry date of the requested visa.

5. Original invitation letter from the Italian/EU citizen family member (download the appropriate form from the forms section), accompanied by a photocopy of a valid identity document or passport, including the signature page.

6. Documentation proving family relationship status, in particular:

7. Marriage/civil partnership/birth certificate (original plus one photocopy).

Note:

- marriage/civil partnership certificates older than 6 months will NOT be accepted;

-certificates issued by a foreign authority other than Malaysia, MUST be translated in English or Italian and legalised by the Italian Consular Office of the issuing Country OR by the Consular Authority in Malaysia of the issuing Country.

-certificates issued by one of the Schengen countries will be accepted only if multilingual, otherwise please refer to second note;

- Italian nationals registered at the AIRE whose marriage certificate has been registered at the Embassy of Italy in Kuala Lumpur are exempt from providing an updated version of the above mentioned certificate. They will be required to provide a self-declaration confirming to be married to the extra-UE citizen.

Note:

-If either or both spouses were previously divorced, the divorce certificate must also be submitted. If issued by a foreign authority other than Malaysia, MUST be translated in English or Italian and legalised by the Italian Consular Office of the issuing Country OR by the Consular Authority in Malaysia of the issuing Country.

For Children

8. If the other parent remains in Malaysia or in another foreign country, an authorization to travel abroad (affidavit) signed by that parent. The affidavit must also indicate who will accompany the minor during travel and must be translated and legalized.

Note: If the minor travels with one parent and is reuniting with the other parent in Italy, no travel authorization is required.

9. Copy of the identity document (passport) of the parent residing in Malaysia who authorizes the minor's travel and signs the affidavit.

10. In the event of a parent's death: the original death certificate, apostilled/legalized and accompanied by an Italian translation.

For Applicants Over 21 Years of Age

11. In addition to the documents referred to in point 8, documentation proving that the family member is financially dependent on the Italian/EU citizen (bank statements, remittance records, and/or other documentation issued within the last year).

12. Where applicable, an affidavit from the person receiving and transferring money to the applicant, apostilled/ legalized, together with a copy of that person's identity document.

If the Applicant Is the Parent of the Italian/EU citizen

13. In addition to the documents referred to in point 8, Documentation proving that the parent is financially dependent on the Italian/EU citizen (bank statements, remittance records, and/or other documentation issued within the last year).

The Embassy reserves the right to request any additional documentation if deemed necessary.
