Medical Treatment Visa (Schengen/National Visa)

1. National Visa Application Form for long stay visas beyond 90 days.

OR

Schengen Visa Application Form (VSU) for short stay visas up to 90 days.

2. One recent [ICAO](#)-compliant photograph.

3. Proof of residence within the consular jurisdiction:

-Proof of legal residence in Malaysia, as long-term stay visa, must have a remaining validity of at least three (3) months beyond the last day of your trip in the Schengen Area for short stay visas up to 90 days

OR

- For long stay visas beyond 90 days three (3) months of remaining validity.

4. Valid passport, original plus one photocopy, with an expiry date at least three months beyond the expiry date of the requested visa.

5. Proof of transportation arrangements:

-Confirmed airline ticket (one way) for long stay visas beyond 90 days.

OR

-Confirmed airline ticket (round trip) for short stay visas up to 90 days.

Note: If the trip includes multiple stops, provide reservations for any intra-stop (trains, flights, car rentals).

6. Proof of accommodation:

-Reservation for accommodation covering the first period (30 days minimum) for long stay visas beyond 90 days. Reservation for accommodation covering the entire stay within the territory of the Member States (hotel, serviced apartment, holiday home, campsite, youth hostel) for short stay visas up to 90 days.

OR

- Rental agreement.

OR

-If staying with family members, friends, or a guarantor, a private accommodation and/or guarantee declaration (download the relevant form from the forms section), along with the host's ID (valid permit of stay for non-European Union citizens) where the signature of the holder appears.

7. **(Only for Schengen visa)** Travel health insurance with a minimum coverage of **€30,000** for emergency hospital treatment and repatriation expenses.

Note:

-A complete coverage table of the insurance must be provided. Insurance presented without this document will be considered incomplete.

8. Proof of financial means:

-Malaysian bank statements showing transactions for the last 3 months, duly signed and stamped by the bank;

Note: bank statements must show bearer's name, address and financial history. At least one of the bank accounts provided must show the salary coming in. Any other bank account showing enough funds can be submitted in addition.

Note: Fixed deposit accounts are not accepted alone. For credit cards linked to accounts, a copy of the credit card and evidence of the credit limit must be provided.

Additional mandatory documentation depending on the Applicant's status

A. If the Applicant Is an Employee

- Income tax returns for the last two years;
- Salary slips for the last three months before the application date;
- Copy of the employment contract;
- Employer's letter authorizing leave, stating:
 - ❖ Leave dates;
 - ❖ Position and salary;
 - ❖ Duration of employment;
 - ❖ Purpose of leave;
 - ❖ Employer's contact details.

B. If the applicant is a business owner or self-employed

- Company registration certificate;

- Property deed or partnership deed if owner or partner of a business, and/or articles of incorporation;

C. If the applicant is financially dependent on another applicant traveling on the same trip

- Dependent spouses/parents should provide spouse's/descendant's employment information i.e. employment letter, payslips and joint income tax return or, in case you do not have a joint income tax, please provide original (plus one copy) of marriage/civil partnership/birth certificates plus sponsorship letter plus passport photocopy of the spouse/partner/descendant;
- Dependent children should provide parents' financial information: last 3 months bank statements, last three payslips, original (plus one photocopy) of the child's birth certificate plus sponsorship letter and plus passport photocopy of the sponsoring parent.

Note:

-Marriage certificates older than 6 months will NOT be accepted;

-Certificates issued by a foreign authority other than Malaysia, MUST be translated in English or Italian and legalised by the Italian Consular Office of the issuing Country OR by the Consular Authority of the issuing Country in Malaysia;

-Certificates issued by one of the Schengen countries will be accepted only in multilingual format (otherwise, please refer to the second note);

D. If the applicant is a minor traveling with only one parent or without parents/legal guardians

- Written consent from both parents granting permission to travel and assuming financial responsibility for the entire trip.

Note:

-If one or both parents do not appear in person on the application day, a parental consent notarised by a Malaysian notary is mandatory. In single-parent families where there is sole custody or guardianship must be duly documented.

-If the parents live abroad, the consent must be notarised by the Italian Consulate of their country of residence (for more information, please visit the following website <https://www.esteri.it/mae/en/servizi/stranieri/traduzionelegalizzazione-dei-documenti.html>). This also applies when parents living abroad nominate a guardian.

- a photocopy of both parents passports must be provided;
- Proof of school enrollment;

E. If the applicant is a student

- Proof of university enrollment;
- Student ID card;
- Recent, official and signed letter from school, college or university in Malaysia stating date of issue, name

of the applicant, type of studies, number of lessons (hours) per week and attendance record;

Additional mandatory documents for visits to Family and Friends

- Proof of family relationship;

Note:

-Certificates issued by a foreign authority other than Malaysia, MUST be translated in English or Italian and legalised by the Italian Consular Office of the issuing Country OR by the Consular Authority of the issuing Country in Malaysia;

Specific Documents Required for a Medical Treatment Visa

- Medical records issued in the country of residence certifying the actual illness and stating the need for specific medical treatment to be provided by a healthcare facility located in Italy.
- Certificate issued by a physician accredited by, or designated by, the Embassy confirming the necessity of the proposed treatment. The related fees shall be borne by the applicant.
- Letter on the official letterhead of the receiving healthcare institution confirming its willingness to provide the required treatment with the patient's consent.

Note: The letter must also specify the type of treatment, the expected start date, duration, and estimated cost. Private healthcare facilities must be accredited by the Italian National Health Service (SSN).

- Certification from the Italian healthcare facility confirming payment of a deposit equal to 30% of the total estimated cost of the requested medical services; alternatively, a specific regional resolution or authorization issued by the Ministry of Health within the framework of humanitarian programmes.
- Evidence of sufficient financial resources to cover the full cost of the planned medical treatment.
- Correspondence between the referring and receiving medical personnel or institutions describing the arrangements made for the provision of the specific treatment, including the patient's expected arrival date and the anticipated duration of treatment, and indicating, where applicable, the name(s) of any accompanying person(s) assisting the patient and the accommodation arrangements made for them during the patient's stay.
- In the case of organ transplantation, a certificate confirming inclusion in the national transplant waiting list, issued by the surgical team intending to perform the operation.
- Accompanying persons must meet all requirements listed under points 1–8 above.

The Embassy reserves the right to request any additional documentation deemed necessary.
